- drop off cakes/slices either late Friday afternoon or early Saturday morning.


The Indoor Bowls Club are looking for new members to stay financial, so if you are interested in joining, please phone Phyllis on 0428 826 015,

Editors Highlight – Improving Club Membership & Attendance (excerpts from Orchids Aust Feb 2024)

Society has changed and to remain relevant, clubs must adapt to meet the challenge. Instead of waiting for new members to come to them, clubs now have to look for ways to broadcast the benefits of joining and ways of attracting and retaining membership. Listed below are some strategies to achieve this.

Please have a read, and we can discuss at our next meeting to maybe implement a few of these ideas in our club.

**Idea 1. –** No one is interested in formal business type meetings anymore and want more casual meetings. All clubs should have a Committee of Management (CoM) that run the business side of the society and monthly meetings should get on with the purpose the society exist – talking orchids! Teach orchids, discuss orchids and appraise orchids. Members attend an orchid club meeting to show off their latest flowering, learn about orchids and socialise. No one attends to listen to the correspondence or the treasurers report on this month's income and expenditure. If members are interested in these details, there can be print out that people can read. **If a member leaves an orchid club meeting without learning one new fact about orchids or orchid growing, that meeting was a <b>FAILURE**.

**Idea 2.** – Prepare the schedule of orchid talks, demonstrations so far in advance that the upcoming topic can be publicised in advance and extend an open invitation to the general public to attend.

**Idea 3.** – Liaise with Bunnings or a plant nursery to stage a display or demonstration to promote our hobby. That is, take our hobby to a place where members of the public with similar interests are likely to congregate. Print out membership forms so they can join the club on the spot.

**Idea 4.** – Conduct a Mother's Day sale of flowering plants and seedlings at a local shopping centre. Once a purchaser has brought an orchid, the next question they will ask is "How do I keep it alive?" Also refer to **Idea 6.** 

Idea 5. - Run a stall at the Markets to sell seedlings/plants and stage a small display. Ditto as in Idea 4.

**Idea 6. –** With every person buying a plant at any public sales event, give a leaflet inviting the purchaser to the club meeting. List the meeting dates, times and venue on the leaflet. Make sure that the leaflet has some colourful, eye-catching graphic. An appropriately worded piece of paper carries a lot more impact than a friendly verbal invitation (that can be forgotten).

**Idea 7. –** Stage a public Open Day at a grower's orchid house to show how orchids are grown. Of course, the necessary media hoopla is a must.

Idea 8. – Introduce a Buddy System within the club so that new members (at their request) can be assigned to an experienced grower for personal one-on-one advice and mentoring. Create a tradesman / apprentice situation – it would benefit both parties. Regrettably in many clubs, there is a tendency for cliques to develop and older members unintentionally keep to their own. This can result in newer

members feeling isolated and not included. Club 'Hosts' may be one way of welcoming and absorbing new members into the club dynamic. The Buddy System is a great way of breaking the ice.

Idea 9. – Visit other orchid club meetings (bus trip) to broaden members orchid growing horizon.

**Idea 10.** – Create 'special interest groups' within the club to cater for those who want to explore orchids that are more difficult to grow. (eg. Paphiopedilum)

These ideas can be adapted to suit any Orchid Club. It is a guide to start discussions with the members.




